Building strong relationships with our mission partners

"We will develop relationships with selected mission partners, working both in the UK and abroad." (Our mission action plan for 2018-2019)

It is vital for a local church to have vibrant relationships with other mission organisations. It keeps us connected with what God is doing further afield and is part of our mission to reach out with the good news of Jesus. This relationship will be expressed through regular prayer, financial support, practical help, exposure visits, guest speakers from those charities.

At our APCM last week we reflected on the strength of 'selecting a few' to do that well. Our PCC has chosen a list of five mission partners, which operate locally, nationally and internationally. That doesn't mean we won't support others at certain times of the year. Of course we also welcome that individual church members will support charities of their choice. We will review the list at regular intervals. We seek to appoint link persons for each of the five - if you have a strong affinity with one of them, do talk to me.

TRINITY (with SHOC) - This is a local homeless charity and has an immediate impact on the local area.

CHURCH ARMY - "Our vision is for everyone everywhere to encounter God's love, and be empowered to transform their communities through faith shared in words and action". Denham Parish has a long-standing connection with them. We aim to reconnect with the Marylebone Project, which works with homeless and vulnerable women.

BIBLE READING FELLOWSHIP - "offer creative programmes and resources for individuals, churches and schools." Denham Parish has been connected with BRF for 60 years. We have been blessed by their daily bible reading notes. They have a focus on schools work and new ministries for families and children, and are the publishers of Messy Church resources.

WYCLIFFE BIBLE TRANSLATORS - "To see God's Word made accessible to all people in the language of their hearts." Wycliffe reach out to communities that do not have the bible in their own language or people that are illiterate. Our Parish has a connection with Samuel Kpagheri (originally set up by the St Mark's service and committee).

TEARFUND - "changes the lives of people who have suffered due to conflict and poverty, working through local churches". We have supported Tearfund's work through our Christmas appeals in recent years.
