FIRST READING: Eph 5.25-33

Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, in order to make her holy by cleansing her with the washing of water by the word, so as to present the church to himself in splendour, without a spot or wrinkle or anything of the kind—yes, so that she may be holy and without blemish. In the same way,

husbands should love their wives as they do their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. For no one ever hates his own body, but he nourishes and tenderly cares for it, just as Christ does for the church, because we are members of his body. 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two will become one flesh.' This is a great mystery, and I am applying it to Christ and the church. Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

All: Glory to you, O Lord.

They said, 'Moses allowed a man to write a certificate of dismissal and to divorce her.' But Jesus said to them. 'Because of vour hardness of heart he wrote this commandment for you. But from the beginning of creation, "God made them male and female." "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be ioined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate.'

Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness; grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit, and according to your holy will, these gifts of bread and wine may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ;

who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Therefore, heavenly Father, we remember his offering of himself made once for all upon the cross; we proclaim his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; we look for the coming of your kingdom, and with this

bread and this cup we make the memorial of Christ your Son our Lord.Great is the mystery of faith:

All: Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again.

And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross, his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world; rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming in glory,

we celebrate this memorial of our redemption. As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we, in the company of all the saints, may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.

All: Amen.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

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An excerpt from Loveology by John Mark Comer (shortened)

There is a bent in all of us to turn gifts into gods. After all, we're hard-wired for worship. Religious people worship and so do agnostics and atheists. We all make something ultimate. We all make sacrifices. Every one of us gives our life away to something or someone greater than ourselves. The novelist David Foster Wallace, a few years before he committed suicide, said, "Everybody worships. The only choice we get is what to worship." We were made to worship God, but sin bends us in the direction of idolatry. We have a slant to take God's gifts and make them into wannabe gods.

Sex is no exception. In Romans, Paul writes, "God gave them over in the sinful desires of their hearts to sexual impurity for the degrading of their bodies with one another. They exchanged the truth about God for a lie, and worshipped and served created things rather than the Creator." (Romans 1.24-25)

Paul's first example of idolatry is sex. That's telling.

In Paul's day, the goddess of sexuality was called Aphrodite. We have writings from the ancient Greeks saying the temple in Ephesus was stacked with one thousand temple prostitutes.

Aphrodite is alive and well.

Today she's the CEO of a multibillion dollar global industry. Entertainment, television, marketing, porn, strip clubs, fashion, cosmetics, health, fitness, plastic surgery, Botox, Viagra – her temple is ubiquitous.

And she's not easy to please. She demands we make sacrifices. We have to give up our innocence, our purity, often our body's wellbeing, and, of course, our freedom. Because when we turn sex into a god, it becomes a cruel tyrant. What is supposed to function as a gift for us to enjoy becomes an addiction with a strange, otherworldly power over us.

That's one of the crazy things about my generation. More than any other in the history of the world, this generation values the freedom of the individual. The sexual revolution of the 1960s made sexual freedom a "right," and "keep your laws off my body" is the mantra of the day.

We're just now learning that what looks like freedom is actually slavery.

We like to define freedom as the ability to do whatever we want, whenever we want, with whomever we want. But to Jesus, that's not freedom that's slavery! Freedom, at least in Jesus' mind, is the ability to do whatever you should. To enjoy the world as God intended. To live fully awake and alive.

That's why the message about Jesus is good news. Because Jesus is king, not Aphrodite.
